

Aloha,

People are asking about the **April 14, 6:00-9:00 p.m.**, "*An Evening in Aiea*" event.

Here are the questions they'll most likely ask...with appropriate answers:

1. What does the \$50 ticket purchase? It is an all-inclusive contribution. It covers the food, the beverage-tasting, the entertainment, the wonderful environment, and the good feeling from helping others attend the school.

(**February 16<sup>th</sup>**, the **\$40 pre-sale tickets** should change to the printed **\$50** ticket price.)

2. How can people buy the tickets? They send the money to the office. Once the office gets the money, we'll give it to you in person or mail it to you.

(We don't want to send them home with kids to sell. We want to reduce the number of people handling them. These are basically \$50 bills they're carrying.)

3. Why are we doing this?

We will raise scholarship funds for our school, which will benefit our students and the whole community. We want to have an enjoyable evening. We want our neighbors and community leaders to join together in an Aiea event that promotes our sense of community. We also want a pleasant event that leaves more people aware that a church and school exist right here in the Heart of the Pacific—Aiea.

4. Should we bring our children?

This is an adult event, but we will provide a Kids Zone for ages 5-12 on the bottom floor of the school. We'll have games, videos, and playground time.

*\*Ages 1-4 are free, but they **remain with the parents** and do not go to the Kids Zone.*

5. What do we want from Our Savior's parents?

We want them to do at least one of two things, if not both:

1st choice--buy tickets, bring friends, and enjoy the evening.

2nd choice--volunteer to help. They should contact Tinell Priddy or the school office.

It's their choice, but we do want them to do one of them.

6. How many people can we have?

400 people is our limit. Space is limited, in an intimate, romantic setting.

(For the Kids Zone, 100 is our limit.)

7. Where can we park?

You can park in the Toys R Us parking lot, but we cannot officially advertise this.

8. If anyone asks, "Will this will be an annual event?"...the answer is yes, if it's successful.
